The Status Quo

No, not the famous British, rock band, although their performance at last year's Clipsal was excellent. Following on from my piece in last month's "Oil", the current Veteran Competitors' newsletter contains an article by editor Alan Wall is titled "The Demise of Two-Strokes", which re-ignited my sadness. But has this forced shift in power units been premature? Gas-Gas and KTM have re-vamped their two stroke models for off-road competition, and reports have been very favourable. And on the marine and outboard side, I've heard that, by persevering with fuel injection, manufacturers have been able to construct two-stroke engines with minimal emissions! Cop that, politicians and environmentalists!

Incidentally, when Minarelli were pacesetters in 125cc Grand Prix racing, at least one formula one team tried to entice him and his designs to

the car side. He knocked back the offer, but it could have been spectacular.

But maybe my feelings are as much related to preserving the status quo (them again!) as to specific engine types. I was saddened to see the Vincent outfits in speedway and road racing replaced by two and four-stroke Japanese units, the demise of big singles in scrambles (I never liked the unit BSA singles), toys compared to Gold Stars and G80CS Matchless, and Manx Norton's in road racing being replaced by lesser – capacity two strokes.

I guess that's what makes our role relevant, being able to show things as near as possible to how they are, with the classic speedway and classic scramble people keeping their heritage alive also.
